4:30pm	NALOXONE	Naloxone Distribution in Grand Traverse County <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Matt Zerilli – Addiction Treatment Services/The PORCH<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ There is a Safe Syringe Program at the PORCH and they have Naloxone available on site○ Offer trainings for local organizations and get the word out that they have kits available○ They provide kits to all ATS programs so all clients leave with kits (about 20-30 per month)	Community Discussion

		<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Estimated that they handout about 50 kits per month● Pam Lynch - Harm Reduction MI<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Naloxone education and distribution occurred monthly at the library for 4 years, prior to Covid.○ Provided staff training for all Traverse Area District Libraries staff○ When anyone comes in for supplies, they receive Naloxone training○ They also do trainings for other organizations in the state○ They do not separate their numbers by county, but the organization provides about 6,000 kits per month in the state of Michigan.○ They have small mobile unit vans and can do pop-up sites at various locations throughout the state○ With the stronger drug supply, more naloxone is needed to reverse an overdose○ They have approached a couple of providers in GTC to get naloxone vending machines● Christina Eickenroth – Munson<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Munson hospitals are handing out naloxone, free of charge, in both Emergency Departments and inpatient for anyone at risk of overdose○ Christina’s presentation slides and Attached to this email is the form to complete to request free Naloxone from MDHHS (a link to complete this form online is provided earlier in these minutes)● Dr. David McGreaham – Northern Michigan Opioid Response Consortium<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ See presentation slides
