A NOTE FROM THE COORDINATOR

Hello coalition members,

Our next coalition meeting is on Thursday, April 13 from 4-5pm. We will be meeting in person at Addiction Treatment Services' the PORCH (1010 S Garfield Ave, Traverse City), with a virtual option as well. Our guest speakers will be Ambassadors from Planned Parenthood who will talk about the work they do and how it intersects with substance use disorders. Everyone is welcome and I hope that you are able to join us! The agenda and Zoom details will be sent out in an email early next week.

Traverse City West Senior High's Mental Health Summit took place on March 1; the day consisted of speakers each hour during the school day and resource tables from local organizations during the lunch hours. The coalition was asked to present in the morning. The presentation began with the students viewing the Predator and Prey documentary (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=bsfyTw6mTBg&t=os). This documentary was created by East Middle School Digital Media Students in 2018 to showcase the opioid crisis in our area. The video was followed by a panel discussion comprised of Christina Dean, RN, BSN, CARN, Clinical Coordinator for Munson Healthcare Opioid Initiative with Community Health; Nancy Dow, featured in the documentary and Family Support Coordinator for Addiction Treatment Services (ATS); Paula Lipinski, CEO of ATS and person in recovery; Adam Newth, Community Outreach Coordinator for ATS and person in recovery; Jeff O'Brien, Chief of Police; and Lauren Reed, coalition coordinator.

COLOR FOR HOPE

We have received a lot of community support so far and our Color for Hope fundraiser continues! These 18"x24" colorable posters come in four unique designs, two Traverse City and two Leelanau posters. The designs include businesses, landmarks, and scenery specific to these areas. The local artist, Susan Alexander, spent hours in the natural areas, businesses, and landmarks of Traverse City and Leelanau County areas to capture the beautiful details. Susan Alexander lost her daughter to the disease of addiction. She is a passionate supporter of this cause and donated these posters as a way to further efforts to curb addiction and increase availability of resources related to education, prevention and treatment. All proceeds from the sale of these posters go to support SUD education, prevention, and treatment in our community.

The cost is \$15 for a set of two posters. The posters are currently available at both Oryana locations, ATS' the PORCH, The Red Dresser, Haberdashery, Premier Floral Design & Gift Emporium, Peninsula Market, Anderson's Market, Leelanau Coffee Roasting Co., The Botanical Gardens, and the AREA Posters Facebook page. You can also email me directly and I can coordinate a pickup with you. Cash, credit cards, or checks, made payable to Catholic Human Services, are accepted.

We have collaborated with the Traverse City Downtown Development Authority for this project. They will be promoting and selling our posters for \$20; \$15 will be going towards our fundraiser and \$5 will go towards the Downtown Relief Fund. We have raised over \$17,500 so far and have purchased Naloxone Safety Kits that have been installed at the Woodmere (2nd floor), East Bay, Peninsula, & Kingsley libraries, Living Hope Church, Salvation Army, the 86th District Court, the 13th Circuit Court, the Goodwill Inn, the Friendship Community Center, Central United Methodist Church, the Northwestern Michigan College Library, the BATA Bus transfer stations, the Traverse City Airport, the Children's Advocacy Center, Boone's Car Wash, and the Grand Traverse County Health Department.
